It's time to start planning your trip to Mabee Scout Reservation for an unforgettable winter adventure! As you prepare for camp, we encourage you to carefully read this guide and share the details with your Scouts and their parents.

Winter Camp is a fantastic opportunity for your unit to experience the great outdoors and enjoy the thrill of CAMP! While the primary focus is on helping Scouts earn Eagle-required merit badges, there's so much more in store. Each day will be filled with exciting activities like shooting, hiking, and climbing. This year, we're also offering new and exciting merit badge classes, including Frisbee Golf, Cycling, and Geology. We have 8 new classes in total! Adult leaders can take advantage of various training opportunities, including IOLS, CPR, and First Aid.

In the evenings, your unit can relax in the comfort of the dining hall and participate in a variety of fun activities, including Dungeons & Dragons sessions, Mario-Kart tournaments, Board Games, Movie Night, and Trivia Night.

Keep in mind that the information in this guide will be regularly updated on our website, so be sure to check back for the latest program details.

To qualify for the Early Bird pricing Scout fees must be paid in full on or before November 1st. Adult leaders taking American Red Cross training will need to pay an additional fee, see page 7 for more information.

Price includes all meals, merit badge fees, free time activities and souvenir patch.

REFUND POLICY

Units must make their final payments for camp on or before December 1st.

Scouts will receive the early bird discounted price of \$175 per Scout if paid in full on or before by November 1st.

Additional Scouts added after the December 1st deadline or participants not paid in full by December 1st will pay a \$25 late fee per Scout. Unit paid fees are only transferable within the same unit.

No refunds of overpayment or cancellations will be made after Dec 1st.

Please note we hire our staff and make equipment purchases based on the number of participants that you have reserved with us. As we purchase equipment, food supplies and hire staff, those funds are no longer available for refunds.

Refunds will not be available for vacations, sports, band, events, school, school events or changing one's mind.

Refund requests will be considered on a case by case basis and must be submitted via email. The request explaining the extenuating circumstances must be sent by 12/30/25. Any request concerning a medical illness must be accompanied by a doctors statement. If approved, the money will be refunded to the entity paying the original fee within 30 calendar days of the approval. Requests must be emailed to wintercamp@okscouts.org no later than 12/30/25.

WINTER CAMP CHECK-IN

Check-in from 9:00am - 11:00am on December 27th

- Troops should arrive as a unit and check-in together.
- If your troop cannot check-in between 9am-11am, please contact us ahead of time.
- If you troop must check-in early, there will be a fee of \$100 per troop or any portion of your troop.
- When you arrive at camp, you will be directed by a staff member to the appropriate place to park.
- If your troop brings a trailer to camp you are allowed to leave it in the campsite, but your vehicles must be parked in the parking lot. (Not in your campsite). **No vehicles allowed in campsites after unloading.**
- One adult leader from your troop will need to check-in at the OA building with all the paperwork listed below, once all the paperwork is turned in your will receive merit badge info and wristbands for the troop.

What to bring to check in:

- Medical Forms for all Scouts and adult leaders (including part C). No sports physicals or school physicals will be accepted.
- A printed unit roster from my.scouting.org, showing all attendees are currently registered in the BSA. Handwritten rosters **cannot** be accepted.
- Out of council troops will need to bring a copy of their councils proof of insurance form.

CAMP CHECK-OUT

The Winter Camp program concludes on December 30th after the conclusion of Block A. Troops should plan on leaving camp by 11:00 am, at the latest.

Before you leave camp be sure to stop by the OA Building for your unit's checkout packet, which includes medical forms, Yeti Awards, and a Winter Camp Patch for each participant. Advancement reports will be available electronically after Winter Camp.

Winter Camp Special

At check out, sign up and pay \$100 deposit for Winter Camp and you will receive 2 FREE LEADERS for the next Winter Camp.

- Winter Camp offers Scouts the opportunity to attend 4 merit badge sessions.
- There are no additional fees for merit badge classes.
- Winter Camp offers 28 merit badge classes, 9 of these are Eagle required.
- Each class block is 1 hour & 45 minutes long.
- Merit Badge classes are capped and we do expect the more popular badges to fill up fast.
- Merit badge registration will run from November 1st through December 22nd. Scouts must be paid in full to register for merit badge classes.

ADULT LEADER TRAINING

- Winter Camp will be offering Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills (IOLS).
- American Red Cross First Aid & CPR with AED will be available for \$75.
- American Red Cross Wilderness First Aid is Available for \$90.

American Red Cross First Aid & CPR with AED

This course provides the essential knowledge to act in life-threatening emergencies, including: how to determine the safe response to an emergency situation; recognize and caring for life-threatening emergencies such as respiratory and cardiac problems; treating injuries, including severe cuts and burns, strains and sprains; threatening sudden illness, caused by poisonings, bites, and stings; and Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

American Red Cross Wilderness First Aid

This course is an intensive introduction on caring for an accident or sudden illness victim when emergency medical help is not immediately available. Topics include assessing the situation, prioritizing care, and supporting the victim until emergency help is available. Specific care is discussed for severe bleeding, head and spinal injuries, breaks, burns, shock and illness related to the environment. CPR/AED training is not included in Wilderness First Aid. CPR certification is required **before** taking this class. **(Both days required)**

Introduction to Outdoor Leadership (IOLS)

Working as patrols, this hands-on course provides adult leaders the practical outdoor skills they need to lead Scouts in the outdoors. Upon completion, leaders should feel comfortable teaching Scouts the basic skills required to obtain the First Class rank. Along with Scoutmaster Specifics this course is required of all direct contact Scouts BSA leaders in order to be considered “trained,” that includes Assistant Scoutmasters.

IOLS is free for any registered Winter Camp leader. **(Both days required)**

Adults not participating with a troop can attend adult trainings for a fee of \$10 per day to cover the cost of food.

Trivia is your chance to show off just how smart you really are! Trivia questions will cover pop culture, academics, & Scouting knowledge. Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place teams.

Climbing

Mabee Scout Reservation has both indoor and outdoor climbing walls available, ensuring no matter the weather we'll have a great time!

Pedal Carts

The Garland Raceway is where campers get an opportunity to try out our pedal carts! Be sure to put this on your list of activities to try out!

Shooting Sports

Mabee Scout Reservation has one of the best shooting sports facilities in the BSA! Rifle, shotgun, and archery will all be available at free time!

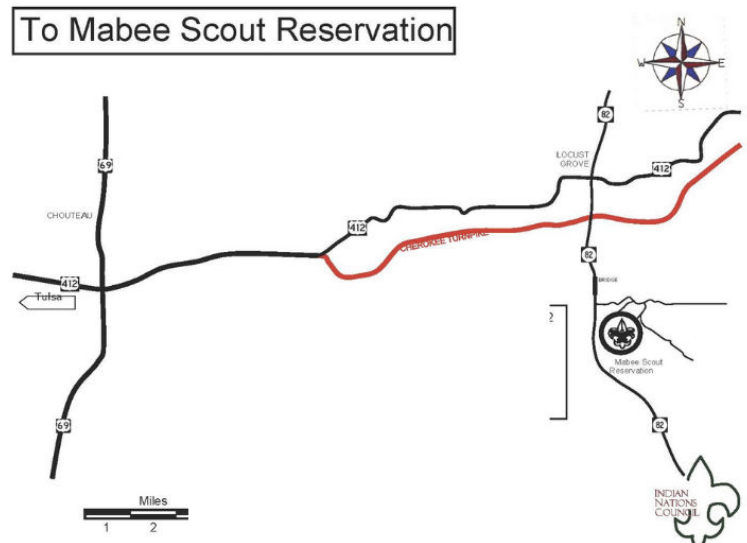

- Mabee Scout Reservation is on the right, about 1 mile from Hwy. 82

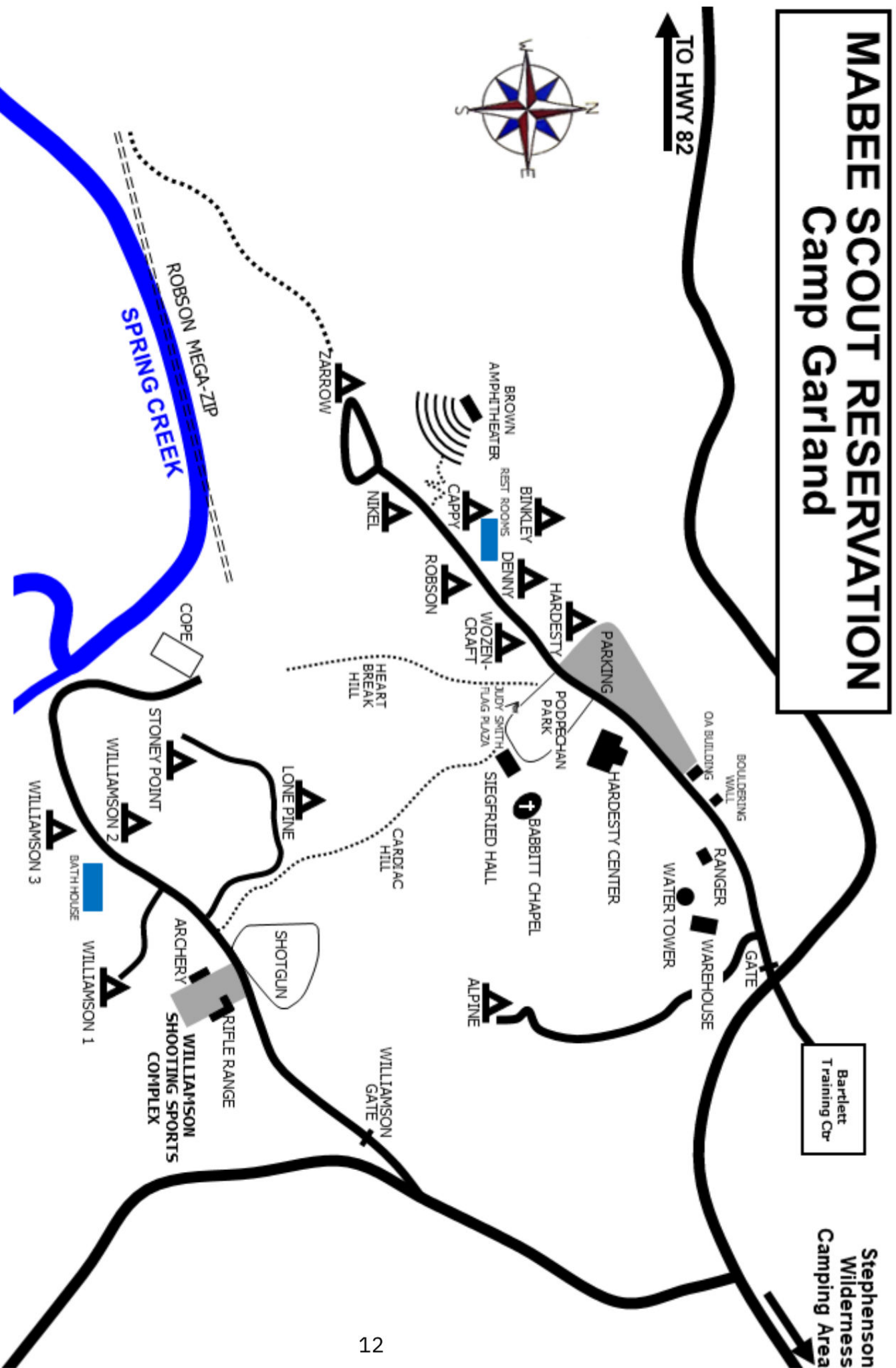
